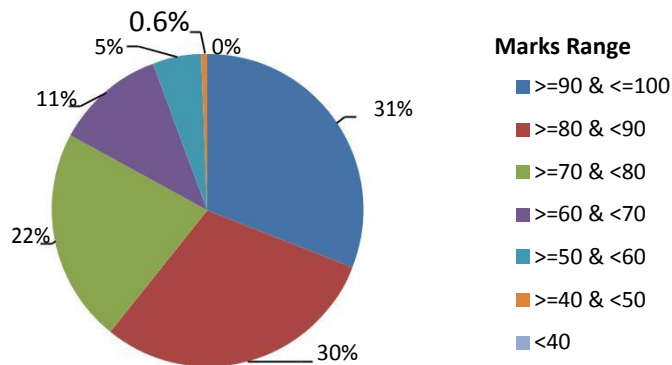

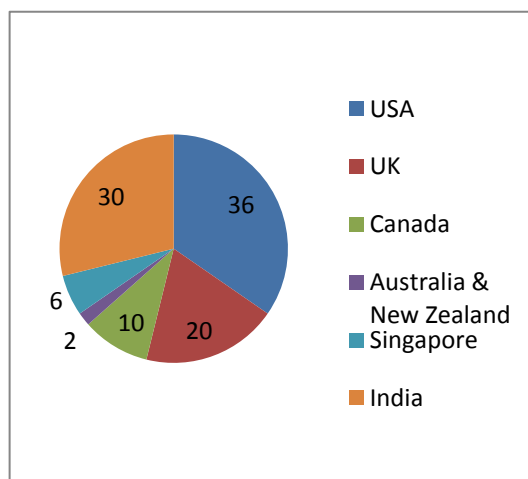
International Career and College Counselling Conference (IC3)

Initiatives

Modern School, Vasant Vihar firmly believes in offering a fair and level playfield to all its students irrespective of academic ability. With this in view certain measures are taken such as **counselling, remedial support classes, accommodation in examinations including provision of extra writing time, separate seating arrangements and also appointment of scribes and amanuensis**. These concessions are extended to over 45 students from grades VI to XII. Additionally, 25 students are given modified question papers that are set in accordance with their learning outcome. The school stands with the premise that students must be assessed on the basis of their ability and not the extent of course material memorized. This has resulted in remarkable outcomes including better adjustment and raised confidence levels of students with learning difficulties.

Helping Hands, a program to provide academic assistance to the junior school students from economically weaker section, continued this year as well. Through Helping Hands, students are offered reinforcement classes conducted in partnership with parents.

The ORKIDS Learning Centre that operates from within the school premises continues to offer support and to students with special learning needs through remedial classes and use of customized learning methodologies.

In a first of its kind, Modern School, Vasant Vihar earned yet another mile to its credit by embracing solar energy. **Solar panels** with a capacity of 150kwp were installed in March 2018 on the terrace of the school building to harness clean and efficient energy for the school's daily requirement. Not only is solar power used for own consumption, the school generates enough to contribute to the area grid.

The school initiated a serious **campaign in favour of the environment** and has decided to take decisive steps in conserving and nurturing the same. As part of the campaign, a giant **water harvesting plant** that contributes rain water directly to the ground water table is fully operational. Use of **plastic materials is restricted** in the school and the same are used extremely sparingly now with an intention to fully wean off in the coming months. This includes sale of plastic water bottles and the use of plastic crockery in the cafeteria. The **reverse osmosis water dispensing system** is upgraded and modernized with definitive accent on consistent availability of clean potable water in the campus.

Equipment for vending intimate hygiene pads for females were installed in the clinic and washrooms as a constructive approach towards destigmatizing menstruation and to encourage open dialogue about the same.

Upgradation of **closed circuit television system** is currently underway in the school to raise the reach and extent of existing security system as also to ensure areas of the campus are now better accessed and covered under surveillance.

A high **tech and high resolution audio system** with sourcing from Shure, Sennheiser and Yamaha was installed in the auditorium in October 2018 lending an elevated aural experience to the audience. The audio system was inaugurated appropriately on the M Extasy, Modern School, Vasant Vihar's annual Music Fest, this year and will be introduced to the MSVV fraternity on Founder's Day 2018.

In order to sensitize students and support staff about the ill effects of tobacco, **National Tobacco Control Program (NTCP)** was initiated in our school. Under the program several activities are organized with a view to educate the target recipients about the ills of drug and substance abuse.

School Safety Committee was formed in compliance with the directive of the Government of National Capital Territory of Delhi and the Directorate of Education and is tasked with ensuring and upholding safety protocols in school as also maintaining 'Minimum Standards of School Safety'. In accordance with the government directive, the Committee comprises Head of School, students, parents, 2 faculty members and 1 member of the non-teaching staff.

Modern School, Vasant Vihar hosted a production of the acclaimed comic satire, **Kissa Maujpur Ka**, performed by the Old Students' Association, Modern School, Barakhamba Road on May 9, 2018 for parents and staff and on May 10, 2018 for students on May 10, 2018. The aim of this collaborative effort of Modern School, Vasant Vihar and Old Students' Association, Modern School, Barakhamba Road, was to foster a deeper bonding amongst the Modern Schools fraternity and present a pressing theme in a light-hearted manner, striking a chord with an audience comprising diverse age groups.

Our school hosted the **NPSC General Body meeting** on September 26, 2018. Over fifty Principals of member schools affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education attended the meeting. Mr Rahul Shivshankar, Editor-In-chief, Times Now, was the keynote speaker and spoke about the importance of teaching learning collaboration. A Play titled 'In her shoes' directed by Ms. Nupur Sandhu, Serenity Surrender Therapist, was also staged. The play addressed the much misunderstood issue of inner and social conflict and was inspired by real life case studies.

CBSE Cluster XX Football Tournament Boys' Under 17 and Under 19 was hosted by our school from October 23 to 30, 2018. It was a mammoth and ambitious task of organization, planning and execution of fixture matches over four campuses in Delhi. 147 teams from 115 schools participated in the event. Mamta Model School, Vikas Puri was the winner in both the categories. Vasant Valley School and Army Public School, New Delhi were declared runners up in Under 19 and Under 17 respectively.

Workshops/Interactive Sessions for Students

Students from Grades VI to VIII learning French at our school attended a **music workshop** conducted by the Neemrana Music Foundation on November 21, 2017 to better understand the nuances of language in an opera. Additionally, an opera, **The Child and the Spells**, composed by the famous Maurice Ravel (Neemrana Music Foundation) was also staged for the students of Grades V to VIII on November 23, 2017.

Tanya Aggarwal, Batch of 2017, conducted an interactive session in July 2018 with IIT aspirants from among student of Grade XI.

Ms. Meenakshi Menon, Professor of Psychology and an alumna of Modern School, Vasant Vihar and University of Delhi interacted with students of Psychology, Grade XI, in July 2018 and discussed the options and advantages of pursuing Psychology at the university level.

Dr. Amrita Dass, Founder Director of ICS International, conducted a career counselling session with the students and parents of Grade X on December 9, 2017. Covering both Indian and foreign studies, she discussed subject eligibility criteria and new and emerging careers. She also held an interactive round with the parents. This and such counselling sessions are an annual practice of our school held with an intention to support parents to make well considered decisions.

Arul Jain, Ayushman Handa and Vedaansh Aggarwal, Grade X, were part of an educational camp organized in Bhimtal by the Goethe Institut, Max Mueller Bhawan, under the aegis of the PASCH program from October 9 to 13, 2018.

Thirty seven art enthusiasts of our school attended **Nature's Palette 2018**, an annual art camp organized by our school from May 19 to 23, 2018. This year the group travelled to Kota Bagh, Jim Corbett National Park, Uttarakhand and created art pieces under the instructions of trained art teachers.

Excursions and Immersion Programs

Several trips and educational as well as immersion programs were organized for the students during the session. Children were taken to far corners of the country and abroad to places of historical, cultural, artistic and environmental value. Exchange programs with schools in Japan, Germany and USA were also held with a view to foster the spirit of internationalism as also to create an understanding of diverse cultures.

Our school has been associated with the Kwansei Gakuin Junior High School, Japan for an educational and cultural exchange program for more than two decades now. As part of the program, this year a group of ten students visited our school on August 2, 2018.

An immersion program with Holton Arms School, Washington DC has also been in place for the last ten years as an educational and cultural enrichment program. This year, a group comprising 12 students and 3 teachers visited our school on August 3, 2018.

Our school is also engaged in an immersion program with Ferdinand-Von-Miller Realschule, Furstenfeldbruck, Germany under the Indo German Classroom Project. The last three years have seen the project develop into a coveted platform of learning, ideating and understanding cultural diversity for the students of both the schools. This year 12 students and 2 faculty visited Germany from November 27 to December 8, 2017.

December 14, 2017	A group of 25 students attended the session on universe in Infra Red. The students carried out different types of experiments, made finger prints at various places and saw them through an Infra Red Camera.

December 15, 2017	A session on Building Mega structures was attended by 6 students. The aim of the session was to understand the requirement of truss for structural stability and its use in various space crafts and also in ISS missions.
January 30, 2018	A session on Building Mega structures was attended by 20 students. Children made bridges using nuts, bolts, sticks. Various methods were taught to check the strength of the bridges. They tested the weight bearing capacity of bridges by putting the bridge on two chairs and applying weight on them.
January 31, 2018	A group of 6 students attended a session on Time Sundial and Creative Sundials. The working of equatorial, vertical, polar, horizontal and cylindrical Sundials was taught. Children made their own sundial and also learnt how to find local time and IST using these.
April 24, 2018	41 students attended a session on Theory of Comets. The students cooked a comet using mud, ammonia, soya sauce and dry ice.
April 25, 2018	An exercise in Rocket making was held for 19 students. They made their own rockets filled with water at different pressures and launched them at different angles.
July 4, 2018	A group of 35 students attended a session on A Grid in the Sky in which RA-DEC system was illustrated and sky map was created
July 6, 2018	A session on Understanding Spectroscopy & star spectroscopy was held. Mystery star activity was undertaken wherein students found the elements present in that star using different light sources.
July 18, 2018	A group of 39 students attended a session on Astrophotography which included details about DSLR camera parts, shutter speed.
July 25, 2018	Students were taught to make a working model of Jantar Mantar observatory. Yantras calculated the sun's shadow and rays falling on different latitudes at different intervals of time.
August 7, 2018	A session on Basics of Rocketry-Construction and Launching of Hydro Rockets was conducted for 36 students. Children saw a presentation on how rockets fly before making their own hydro rockets using pet bottles.
August 8, 2018	Working of a Barn Door Tracker was explained to a group of 13 students who then set up their own Barn Door Trackers to click clear photos of a laser.
August 20, 2018	The layers of the sun, solar prominences, granulation on the sun, auroras, coronal mass ejection, and other observatories were explained to an assembly of 33 students. Children saw the sun through the Dopsonian and the refractor telescopes.
August 21, 2018	16 children attended the session from 2.00 – 4.00 p.m. on August 21 st , Tuesday. It was a session on IMAGE PROCESSING – various softwares were talked about. Children were taught to make histograms and process brightness of photos. Softwares like Registax, Autostacker were used on computers in the lab to process images. GIMP, PIPP, Star Trails.

Members of the Vyom club attended an evening **astronomy camp** on October 22, 2018. The students were shown the refractor and reflector telescopes. They operated a Dobsonian device to view Moon, Mars, Saturn and the traffic light in the summer triangle. Students were also exposed to the concept of Astrophotography and explained the working of a DSLR camera and key concepts like ISO, shutter speed and aperture. Students captured photos of the sky and celestial objects like the summer triangle, Mars, Saturn, the Moon and its craters.

Chess

Vardaan Nagpal, Grade XI, is currently an International Master and 2 norms away from The Grandmaster title. His recent achievements include:

1. Best Junior Under 18 title at The San Sebastian Open Tournament, Spain
2. Fourteenth position out of 500 players in Benasque Open Tournament, Spain

Prithu Gupta, Grade IX, was invited to play the Portuguese League- First Division, wherein he competed against a formidable line up of 15 Grandmasters and 18 International Masters. He scored some crucial points on the second board for his team, GD Dias Ferreira, and helped earn top slot for his team breaking a 4 year long jinx.

Prithu continued to excel with a second Grand Master norm in the Biel chess festival where he bagged the 11th position, ahead of several grandmasters and International Masters. He also added a whopping 23 ELO points to his current Fide rating of 2436. The fact that he played only three strong tournaments this year and scored GM norms in two of them is an unparalleled achievement. **Prithu is deemed among the fastest rising players in the world.**

Garv Rai, Grade VI, raised his International Rating in Chess by 232 points. He participated in the 1st Battle on the Board Chess Tournament held at Ghaziabad from 27 Sept. to 2 Oct. 2018. He remained undefeated till the 9th round out of possible 10 rounds. He overpowered many high rated players and scored 7.5 points out of a possible 10. Garv raised his rating by 117 points and secured the third position in the below 1800 category, earning a cash prize of Rs. 5,000/- and a trophy.

Garv also participated in the 1st Goa International Grand Masters Chess Tournament – B Category, held at Goa, from 13 to 16 Oct. 2018. He scored 7 points on 10 and secured the first position in the Under-11 category, receiving a cash prize of Rs. 6,000 and a trophy.

Garv Rai's international rating has now climbed to 1783.
